Dear Ms Hansen

Thank you for your letter of 2 June 2022 to the Commissioner raising concerns of your client NZDSOS regarding the covid-19 vaccine. Based on concerns that your client has regarding the vaccine, you set out various reasons for urgent and serious action from 'Police to investigate whether Medsafe is failing to discharge its obligation to provide safe and effective medicines'. Your client seeks a full Police investigation into Medsafe's practices and that the vaccine rollout is immediately stopped.

You express concern in relation to the Centre for Adverse Reactions Monitoring (CARM) and its ability to monitor adverse reaction to the covid-19 vaccine. You say that many hundreds of deaths are occurring following the vaccine that are not being reported to CARM, and that the community is being deprived of essential safety information that could inform individual and parental vaccine choices.

Police notes that the most recent reporting by CARM includes the following information:

For the Comirnaty (Pfizer) vaccine



Adverse events following immunisation with COVID-19 vaccines: Safety Report #43 – 30 April 2022

Based on information from CARM, approx. 11 million doses of the Comirnaty (Pfizer) vaccine have been administered, there were over 62,000 Adverse Effects Following Immunisation (AEFI) reports,

of which 3,287 were regarded as serious. However, CARM also provides the following summary of reported deaths: (<https://www.medsafe.govt.nz/COVID-19/safety-report-43.asp>)

“Up to and including 30 April 2022, a total of 160 deaths were reported to CARM after the administration of the Comirnaty vaccine. Following medical assessments by CARM and Medsafe it has been determined that:

- 99 of these deaths are unlikely related to the COVID-19 vaccine
- 48 deaths could not be assessed due to insufficient information
- 10 cases are still under investigation.
- [3 deaths](#) were likely due to vaccine induced myocarditis (awaiting Coroner’s determination)”

The New Zealand Medicines and Medical Devices Safety Authority (MEDSAFE) appears to provide extensive data and analysis regarding the covid-19 vaccination programme, that includes information about the effects of the vaccine. This information does not support the claims of your client regarding alleged adverse effects of the vaccine.

The concerns that you raise for your client are not the first correspondence to Police from the group that refers to itself as NZDSOS. For example, in an NZDSOS presentation sent to Police concerns were raised that the vaccine contains “microscopically visible artificial technology (“microtechnology”). The NZDSOS states that scientists that have discovered this microtechnology in the vaccine are anxious for their safety as “*they believe what they see is indicative of an unimaginable crime*”.

Having considered the information provided on behalf of your client, and the earlier correspondence from the NZDSOS, I can advise that Police does not accept the views expressed by NZDSOS and does not intend to respond by way of an investigation of Medsafe or other agencies involved in the administration of the covid-19 vaccine.
