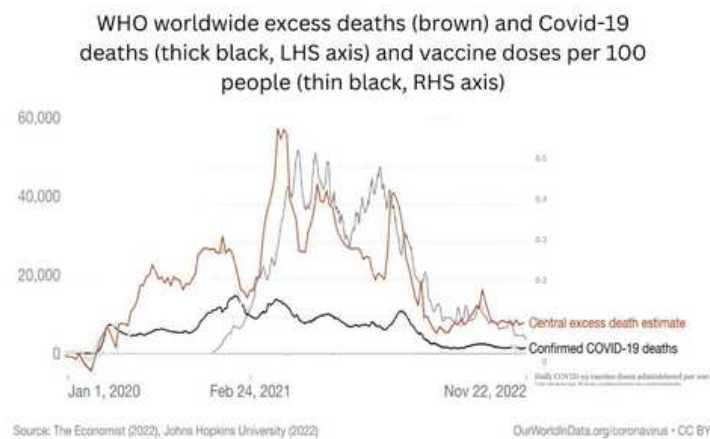


WAS IT ALL FOR NOUGHT?

One would expect excess deaths in a pandemic right? Except that we were told we could help mitigate deaths and save the hospitals by staying home, distancing, masking up and getting vaccinated. Furthermore the deaths from/with the pandemic-causing covid-19 seem trivial compared to excess deaths from other causes.

The data in this chart is referenced in "Excess mortality across the countries in the Western World since the COVID-19 pandemic: 'Our World in Data' estimates of January 2020 to December 2022'."



The authors state that "Excess mortality has remained high in the Western World for three consecutive years, despite the implementation of containment measures and COVID-19 vaccines. This raises serious concerns. Government leaders and policymakers need to thoroughly investigate underlying causes of persistent excess mortality."

A more recent estimation of global excess deaths by Rancort et.al., put excess deaths for the 2020-23 period estimation in excess of 30 million. The authors present an argument that the cause of the excess deaths are biological and psychological due to mandates and socio-economic changes, non-covid-19-vaccine medical interventions including mechanical ventilators, pharmaceuticals and the denial of antibiotics, and covid-19 vaccine rollouts.

With bird flu and monkey pox seemingly raising their heads again, are we going to expect different outcomes by doing the same things we did in covid?
